


# Directors Message

It doesn't happen every day


that you see a dream coming true right in front of your eyes. This whole experience of witnessing your second home getting build brick by brick is truly amazing.




# Mamta Bansal


#### 2. Who was your favorite Teacher at HMU?

#### 2. Who was your favorite Teacher at IIMU?


Ans: Prof. Sriram who taught us finance


#### 3.If you get a chance to change one thing about your life at IIMU, what'd it be?

#### War of wings:




#### Handball:

The five-month stint at Purdue equipped me with an understanding of the region's business, cultural, and political environments. 






## **ADHYAY**
